### Attendance

Please be reminded that we will now be following Lincolnshire County Council's protocols for fining parents who take their children out of school during term time without there being an exceptional circumstance. This includes holidays as we know that parental decisions to take holidays during term time are having a severe effect on not only individual children's outcomes but also on school data overall.

All applications for absence that are not illness related will need to be applied for by completing an 'Exceptional Circumstances' form and this can be gained from the school office or from our website.

Once the criteria has been met for issuing a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN), LCC would administer the fine and parents would be charged on a per parent, per child basis.

**The attendance figure overall for our school this academic year is currently 96.34%. Let's work together to bring this figure above 97%, which is our school expectations for all children.**

## Starting School in September 2020?



If your child, or someone you know, is due to start school next September, please be aware that the application round is now open and closes on January 15<sup>th</sup> 2020. Should your child have a sibling in school, make sure that this is outlined within the application as this will strengthen the application and secure a place at the school. If someone you know is interested in sending their child to our school we would love to hear from them and will be happy to show them around.

**This year we have had a record number of enquiries again for places and early indications show that we will be oversubscribed in Reception next year, which means we have more families than ever wanting to access our wonderful school. We look forward to welcoming the newest intake of children into school ready for the next academic year.**

### Clubs

This term, we have yet another vast array of clubs on offer and we are delighted that we are able to offer this fantastic provision for our children. There are still some places left in clubs, please contact the school office who will be able to assist you in booking children into clubs.

### Informing the School Office of changes to picking up arrangements



We recognise that changes can occur with respect to collection arrangements at the end of the school day. However, we have recently noticed, once again, that the number of calls the school receives in a day asking us to inform children of changes has increased dramatically.

To reduce the additional burden this administration is placing on the school; please can we ask that, where possible, arrangements are made prior to the school day starting and changes are only communicated via the school office as a last resort. Thank you for your cooperation with this.



### School PE Kit

Each class has their own days in which PE is taught, and these can often change if other events take place so for this reason, it is useful if PE kits could stay in school all week. Please be reminded of the school PE kit expectations-we will be informing you if your child is repeatedly without their kit as at least 2 hours of Physical Education per week is statutory within the curriculum.

**Indoor:** Plain white T-shirt & Navy/black shorts or skirt (gym and dance is in bare feet)

**Outdoor:** Plain white T-shirt, navy/black plain tracksuit top & bottoms, spare socks, trainers.
