Governor Focus-Sam Eden

(Ex-Officio Governor)



It might seem odd to see that I am indeed a Governor, but the role of the Headteacher also brings with it a requirement to sit on the board of Governors.

The reason for this is that I make very important decisions about the school on a day-to-day basis and it is my role to oversee the effective running of the strategic development of the school. As a Governor, my view is as important as the rest of the board and we make decisions together as a collective.

I am very proud to be a Governor, and the Headteacher role is such that my knowledge base of events happening in and around school are required at every meeting. Therefore, I am a member of the Standards and Curriculum Committee, Staffing and Finance Committee and attend all Full Governing Body Meetings.

The Governing Body has welcomed many different people onto it in the past, but we have now reached a period of stability that is allowing for the continuing growth and development of the school. To echo what previous Governors have said, this is a wonderful time for the school, and I am thrilled with the ongoing positive climate.



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First Aid-Reporting and Recording



We are constantly looking at our systems and processes in school to check that they are rigorous and robust and when it comes to applying First Aid, we have decided to change the approach previously taken and simplify the process into 3 stages.

Stage 1

From this point forward, we will be writing any **minor** issues in a child's reading record. These minor issues are defined to be where first aid has not had to be applied. For instance, if a child has fallen over and has a grazed knee, this will now be communicated via the reading record. Please ensure you check these regularly. This will not be entered into the accident book as no First Aid has been applied.

Stage 2

We have revised our Accident Book and recording procedures, so that where a child requires First Aid, a copy of this will be entered into the Accident Book, and filed accordingly. These will not be sent home but again, you will be alerted via the Home/School diary. Should you wish to obtain a copy of the report, please see Mrs Beard in the school office. For more serious accidents, we will phone parents as well as undertaking the above. Where a child has bumped their head and this is causing concern, in addition to the above, we will issue a wristband that states the time of the bump and alerts all staff of the head bump and to remain vigilant. Again, we will always contact you in this instance to talk through the accident.

Stage 3

Where a child has suffered an injury within school that requires them to be taken to hospital, we will do all of Stage 2, but will also complete a form via Lincolnshire County Council that details the seriousness of the accident, what happened and what has been done to prevent the accident being caused again.

Working in this way, we will be able to monitor where the accidents are taking place, how frequently accidents are happening and then ensuring that the correct level of action is taken to minimise the risks to children in certain scenarios. Please ensure that you use the Home/School diaries as a 2 way communication. The same books have been ordered for next year and we will be using them in this way more than ever. Should you have any queries, please do not hesitate to ask.
