## Please return your forms!



Please be reminded that the form given out asking for your National Insurance information in line with the eligibility for Free School Meals and Pupil Premium are requested back into school as soon as possible.

This information is vital in school as many parents who might be eligible are often unaware and do not realise their entitlements to different services and provision.

If a parent is eligible, the school receives $£ 1,300$ in funding to support the teaching and learning and enrichment of this child's education. The use of this money is absolutely pivotal in raising aspirations and closing the attainment gap to ensure that every pupil receives access to an outstanding education.

Please send these forms into school as soon as possible. Mrs Beard will happily accept them at the school office or they can be sent via your child's Class Teacher.

Class Italy and Class China Request

The adults in these two classes have asked for a polite notice to be included on the newsletter to ask for parents to come up towards the actual classroom when collecting a child. Sometimes, with the amount of parents picking up at this time, staff need to be confident they are sending children to the correct adult. Please also be reminded that we operate a password system for other people picking up your child, but please let us know in school if someone else is collecting.
In line with school policy, we will not allow children in these classes to leave with anyone under the age of 16. If staff feel that the person collecting is below this age, they will refuse to let a child leave school premises and alternative provision will need to be made.
