


Home Learning Activity - Maths

Today, your challenge is to have a go at making doubles!




Watch this episode of the Numberblocks



Have a go at filling in the other half of the butterflies. Remember, to double a number means to have the same amount on both sides. Can you have a go at writing the number sentences?






