After you have read the story, have a go at completing Miss Leggett's challenges. You can choose as many as you like to complete.



- I find this book so funny because of all of the different rhyming words. Some of the sentences sound very silly! Can you imagine owls sitting on towels, or lizards sitting on wizards??? Can you draw your favourite part and write the rhyming sentence? Perhaps you could think of your own.
- What do you know about frogs? It's getting to the time of year where we can find lots of tadpoles and froglets about! Can you find out some facts about frogs and share them with me?
- How many animals are there in "Oi Frog"? Can you write a list of all of the different animals you can find in the story?

Reading Challenge

- ⇒ The author of "Oi Frog" has written other follow up books such as "Oi Cat" and "Oi Duck Billed Platypus"! Can you find them (remember to look on Youtube if you don't have the book at home). Which one is your favourite?
- ⇒ Can you read a bedtime story to someone in your family this week? You might need to practice reading your book a few times first. Can you try and do the different voices of the characters?
- ⇒ Which part of a word needs to be the same for it to rhyme? Can you work out the rule? You could have fun and make up your own silly rhyming sentences (you could even use some "pseudo" (not real) words!
