



Home Learning Activity - Maths



Today, we are going to have a go at taking away.

Use your "first, then, now" sentences to help you. You can cross off each item to show that you have taken it away.


Challenge 1: Use your "first, then and now" sentences to explain what is happening.

First,  there are 4 bananas.	Then,  Hungry Monkey eats 2.	Now, 2 how many are left?
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

First,  there are 5 bananas.	Then,  Hungry Monkey eats 1.	Now, how many are left?
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First,  there are 7 bananas.	Then,  Hungry Monkey eats 3.	Now, how many are left?
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Challenge 2: Can you have a go at writing the number sentences?

First,  there are 2 bananas.	Then,  Hungry Monkey eats 1.	Now, how many are left?

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$$\square - \square = \square$$


Challenge 3: Can you use objects around the house to make up your own take away sums using "first, then and now"? Have a go at recording these in your home learning book.

1. There are lots of different animals in this story. I wonder which one is your favourite? Can you draw it and label all of the different body parts? Perhaps you could find out a few facts about it and share them with me?
2. This term, we would have been learning about riddles. A riddle is a few sentences which describes something or someone. Can you write a riddle about one of the animals? You can use the template (attached) to help you.
3. Make your own Commotion in the Ocean puppets and pretend to be the different animals. I wonder what their different voices sound like? Will the shark speak in a mean voice? Will the octopus speak in a silly voice? Make up a puppet show for your family.

Reading Challenge

1. If an adult reads you an animal description from *Commotion in the Ocean*, can you guess which animal they are talking about? Can you have a go at reading one of the descriptions to an adult for them to guess?
