All children from Year 2-6 have been issued with a published Homework Book that they will complete set pieces of homework in. Children in Reception will continue to be asked to read, practice their sounds and complete simple tasks whilst Year 1 will extend their homework tasks beyond EYFS and begin to be asked to do more as the year progresses and in line with transition to Year 2.
