School responsibilities:

Staff will;

- o Ensure that children are happy in school and enjoying their education
- o Ensure that the school is a safe and friendly environment
- o Ensure that each child achieves their full potential as a valued member of the school community
- o Inform parents about your child's attendance, three times a year, and more frequently for those falling below the levels expected
- o Inform parents of the attainment, effort and progress made in their child's learning
- o Provide an excellent curriculum to empower and inspire
- o Achieve high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and reward success, effort and achievement
- o Meet parents to inform them of children's progress, across the school year, and maintain regular contact as necessary
- o Inform parents about your child's education and school activities, meeting at mutually convenient times to discuss progress and concerns
- o Offer opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of the school
- o Ensure that the learning environment is clean, well maintained and visually interesting
- o Nurture, care and foster each child to be the best they can be!



Learner responsibilities:

I will;

- o Arrive to school on time
- o Follow the Golden Rules every day
- o Be equipped and ready to learn
- o Complete all work asked of me, including homework
- o Attend every day unless I am ill or there is an exceptional circumstance
- o Wear appropriate school uniform
- o Remember the only jewellery allowed is a watch and stud earrings
- o Leave toys, electrical items and sweets at home
- o Tell an adult who works in school if I am unhappy or hurt.

Parents/Carers responsibilities:

Parents Will;

- o Support the school's Golden Rules and behaviour policy and model these to your children
- o Uphold the vision and values of the school and remind your children of their meaning.
- o Value and encourage your child's education
- o Recognise the importance of your child's regular attendance at school and aim to keep attendance levels above 95% and strive for 97+%
- o Ensure that the children arrive on time, having had a good night's sleep, eaten breakfast and are ready for school learning to take place
- o Ensure that the children are dressed in the correct school uniform, including appropriate footwear
- o Label all of your child's belongings
- o Attend teacher/parent meetings and help the child meet the targets set
- o Take an interest with your child in their work at school and at home by helping with home tasks including reading and spelling
- o Keep your child at home if they are unfit to be at school and inform the school office by 9.15am **each day of the absence**
- o Communicate with the school regarding anything which may affect your child's education or welfare
- o Ensure that the school always has up to date telephone numbers in case of emergency
- o Apply in good time for known absences (exceptional circumstances only) and keep family holidays for the 13 weeks of holidays per year rather than term time
- o Encourage your children to be as independent as possible
- o Keep appointments and let school know if you are unable to attend
- o Inform school of our child's medical needs, ensuring their requirements can be met (e.g. spare inhalers kept in school)
- o Abide by the Parent/Carer and Visitor code of conduct

To ensure we work together as effectively as possible, supported by our Governing Body, we ask that all parents and carers treat all school adults with the utmost respect and respond to issues as calmly as possible in a respectful manner and never use social media to attempt to resolve issues.
