To link further with our new Behaviour Steps and Golden Rules, we are continuing to recognise and reward those children who continuously make the right choices and decisions in everyday life. In addition to the certificates we award on a weekly basis, we are pleased to announce the arrival of the new 'Good Neighbour Award'.

Staff and the school council have worked alongside Reverend Alan Littlewood, our local vicar, to create the award which will recognise those children who continuously demonstrate good neighbourly qualities towards their peers, and adults, inside and outside of school.

Children will be nominated by adults who hear of a child's good deeds and we will look to award the children as and when we have enough information to merit the award. Each child who receives an award will be asked to collect it within our celebration worship on a Friday and will receive a special clip-on shield badge to keep and wear with pride. Their name will also be added to the 'Good Neighbour Roll of Honour' in the school hall and we will communicate any good neighbours here on the school newsletter.

Music Success



Since starting her post as Acting Deputy
Headteacher, Mrs Talbot has been undertaking
many leadership tasks to support the continued
development of the school. You will have noticed
that the school is having a renewed focus on music
and this is being led by Mrs Talbot. Ensuring our
school is at the cutting edge of knowledge and
learning, Mrs Talbot has been asked to become a
Lead Practitioner for Lincolnshire and help develop
the music curriculum across the county.

As a Lead Practitioner, Mrs Talbot has also been asked to provide exemplar lesson plans for Year 1 and 2, which teachers can download and then teach, supported by a video of Mrs Talbot teaching the actual lesson. These lessons are being filmed, by a professional film company over the last 3 weeks of Term 4, and will be made available to teachers over the next few months. This is a fantastic opportunity for Mrs Talbot and Ancaster Primary School as we continue to show everyone we are being the best we can be.

Appropriate School Uniform

We adopt the approach that what a child wears to school reflects his/her attitude to learning. It portrays the school ethos and shared positive values. Our uniform consists of the following:

- School royal blue jumper
- White or blue polo shirt or shirt
- Black or grey trousers, shorts or skirt
- Or a white and blue summer dress
- Grey, black or white tights/socks
- Black shoes

Children will also need a PE Kit consisting of: Plain white round neck T-shirt (with or without school logo), black shorts, plimsolls and trainers. These are all to be kept in a named drawstring bag. Children are to have their kit at school at all times and should only go home during the holiday periods.

Please also be reminded that jewellery is limited to stud earrings only for health and safety reasons. Under no circumstances should make up or nail varnish be worn to school.

Whilst we understand the financial demand of uniform, we cannot take responsibility for the loss of clothing, particularly where an item has not been labelled. Recently, too much teaching time has been lost due to children mislaying their unnamed clothing. Please ensure all items of school clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name.
