
And help the dogs to get a fair share of the bones. Remember to make sure they have the same amount!

Home Learning Activity - Literacy

This week, read "Handa's Surprise" by Eileen Brown. If you don't have the book to hand, you can watch it through this clip.

Afterwards, try and complete Miss Leggett's challenges. You can choose as many as you like to complete.



1. Handa uses different *adjectives* (describing words) to describe the fruit (such as "soft yellow banana" or "sweet smelling guava). Can you taste some of the food that was in the story and write your own adjectives to describe them?
2. Where does Handa live? Do you think she lives in the same country as us? Why not? Handa lives in the country Kenya. Can you find about what it is like to live there? How far away is Kenya from the United Kingdom? Can you find it on a map and tell me some facts?
3. Can you write your own version of the story where you take some presents to your friend? What would you take? Who will come along and take your presents?

- ⇒ Imagine you are in the story. What could you see, hear, smell, feel and taste?
