

Home Learning Activity - Maths

This week, we are going to be learning about **capacity**. Capacity means measuring how much a container can hold. At this stage of your child's learning, they should have lots of opportunities of pouring liquid from one container to another and talking about if a container is full, half full or empty and comparing the difference.

Challenge 1: Can you tell me if these containers are full, half full (remember what half means?) or empty?







Challenge 2: Can you fill containers to full, half full or empty?

- Gather a set of plastic bottles (or different containers) and place them in a tray, sink or a bath
- Use a jug or a bowl to pour some water into each container
- You could also try to find different ways of filling the containers, such as holding them under water to see what happens
- Talk together about how full the containers are. Can you describe them using **full**, **half full**, **nearly full**, **nearly empty** and **empty**?

Questions to ask your child to check their understanding:


- Can you pour some water into this bottle to make it half full?
- Can you make this bottle *nearly empty*?
- I think this bottle is full. Do you think I am right?
- Which bottle is the fullest? How do you know?

Home Learning Activity - Literacy

We are going to be learning to spell polysyllabic words (these are words that have more than one syllable). Join these words together to make a new word.



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
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
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
