Reading & Spellings

Daily reading books will be sent home. Practising high frequency words and common exception words is a vital part of homework for Year 3 children as they learn to read more fluently and develop their comprehension skills.

Please continue to read every day with your child and record this in their diary. Children will be able to change their book, if their diary has been signed and the book is completed. To develop their comprehension, it is good to discuss the book with your child, supporting with any misconceptions that may arise. Again, we appreciate your support.
