	English writing and reading activities	Complete ✓
1.	Reading and word class activity: find and copy 3 words from your reading book that start with a capital letter.	
2.	Vocabulary work: Find 3 exciting/new words in your reading book and write them down.	
3.	Reading Comprehension task: Write 1 question you could ask someone to find out if they have read this book carefully.	
4.	Vocabulary work: How many tricky words can you spell correctly? See how many you can write down in a minute.	
5.	Reading and descriptive writing activity: Draw a picture of your favourite character from the story. Write labels and/or captions to describe who they are and what you have learnt about them from your reading.	
6.	Reading and creative writing activity: Make a Wanted poster for a toy or a member of your family. What adventures and mischief have they been up to?	
7.	Reading and creative writing activity: Draw a picture of one of the settings in the story then write a sentence of where it is and what happened there.	
8.	Reading and sequencing activity: draw a story map to retell main events of your book in the correct order.	
9.	Reading and creative writing activity: Lots of our story books have magical creatures inside them. Make up your own magical creature. Draw it, colour it then write about it. What is it called? What does it like to eat? Where does it live? Does it have any magical powers? Maybe you could write a story about its adventures?	
10.	Writing activity: can you write down all the letters of the alphabet in order?	
11.	Reading and writing task: sound out all the letters of the alphabet and name them.	

12.	Phonics task: Use your rainbow sound cards (phase 2 and phase 3) and see how many words you can make. Line up your teddies and give them all an alien name. Can you teach your teddies some phonics?	
13.	Phonics task: Play 'Splat' with an adult or friend. Lay out 5 or 6 of the rainbow word cards and call out a phoneme. Whoever high fives or splats the phoneme first gets to keep it. Repeat until all of the sound cards have been used and see who is the winner.	
14.	Phonics task: Play with your tricky word bugs. Make another set and play SNAP. Ask an adult to hide them around the house for you to find. Once you find a word bug read it and keep it. How quick can you collect all of your word bugs?	
15.	Writing task: Play a rhyming game with your adult. At school we like to make up funny rhyming names for each other (e.g. Jack, Sack, Dack, Vack, Lack). Make up a funny rhyming name for your adult.	
16.	Reading and Writing task: Read your favourite story with an adult. You could talk about how the characters are feeling. Use post-its to make speech bubbles to show what they are thinking or what else they could be saying.	
17.	Phonics task: Choose a letter from the alphabet and go on a object hunt to find as many objects as you can that all start with the same sound. Can you write a list in your books?	
18.	Writing task: Can you write down 5 family member's names? Draw a picture of them to match.	
19.	Reading and writing task: Choose a picture from one of your story books. Write a short sentence to describe it.	
20.	Writing task: Draw a picture of your pet and write a sentence to describe it. If you don't have a pet, draw and describe your dream pet.
