### Medical & Dental Appointments

As you are aware, the school takes the attendance of our pupils very seriously and we expect children to be in school all day every day, unless in exceptional circumstances and when serious illness prevents this.

We understand that emergency medical appointments can be difficult to obtain outside of school hours, however, we do know that routine medical, hospital and dental appointments booked in advance can be arranged outside of the school day and in the school holidays; we know that medical professionals are keen to support families and schools in this.

If your child has to have time off school for medical or dental appointments, **we will need to see the appointment letter or card to authorise this absence and ask that notification is given to the office in advance of you collecting your child**, even when this is an early collection at the end of the school day as the school must keep a record of all absences regardless of how short these might be.
