**Parent Consultations**

We had 96% of our parent body make, and attend, parent consultations with Class Teachers last week. We aim for 100% as these meetings are a statutory requirement. If you have not had a meeting, we will be contacting you to arrange a meeting or you can do so by speaking with the Class Teacher.

**Headlice**

We have been notified by a number of parents that they are finding that they are having to treat headlice on numerous occasions due to the spread of headlice within school. We are keen to support parents in tackling this issue but ask in the first instance that treatment is applied followed by continuous checking for up to two weeks after treatment to identify and remove the eggs that are laid prior to the treatment being applied. When applying the solution, this will not remove the eggs, only the active lice.
