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#### **Term Time Holiday Requests**

We have noticed recently that there has been a sharp rise in the number of requests for holidays during term time. Please be reminded that we will only authorise absence where it is deemed an 'exceptional circumstance' and family holidays do not meet these requirements. There are strict procedures in place from the Local Authority and Department for Education for schools to consider imposing penalty notices to parents where term time holidays are taken regardless of being told that the absence will not be authorised. To ensure that your child receives the best possible education, they need to be in school and we ask that you refrain from booking trips that will impact on pupil learning time.
