Your cooperation with attendance is absolutely vital. Time spent away from school is time that a child can never get back. Unless they are genuinely unwell or there is an exceptional circumstance, all children are expected in school. Where attendance falls below 90%, a letter will be sent home to parents detailing the exact attendance figure and the next steps that could possibly be taken. In more extreme circumstances, where attendance falls below 80%, we will need to notify our Education Welfare Officer.
