New Safeguarding Lanyard System

As part of our commitment to safeguarding, we have devised a new system in school for children and adults to recognise who is who. All school staff now wear personalised lanyards which have an ID card attached to them. Anyone will be able to recognise a member of school staff by the fact that an 'Ancaster' lanyard is being worn.

There are also different coloured lanyards for other people in school and the children are aware of these.

Red Lanyards are worn by visitors to the school. Green lanyards are worn by volunteers and Orange lanyards are worn by Governors. The lanyards have either Visitor, Volunteer or Governor printed on them so it is clear who is who. ID cards are also worn by these groups. This system is now fully operational and understood by all in school.
