The children are working incredibly hard every day and I am thrilled with the commitment and readiness to learn from everyone in school. This is an extremely exciting time to be involved with the school as we are very much ensuring that every area of this school is the best it can possibly be for your child. I cannot thank you enough for your positivity and continued support. 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Crossing Patrol News



As we are sure you are aware, the crossing patrol has not been manned by the very lovely Mrs Ann Butters, who has recently decided to retire from this position. We wish her all the very best in her future endeavours and know that she will continue to be a very special friend of the school.

The crossing site is being monitored closely by Lincolnshire County Council and an observation of the parking and crossing took place last week. From this, it was found that vehicles were parked sensibly and pedestrians were behaving safely. There was a slight issue in which pedestrians were experiencing difficulty in crossing the road, as people chose to cross at different parts of the road and none of which were at the crossing point. The recommendation is that everyone crosses at the designated crossing point as this is a place that regular drivers recognise as a place they expect to see children and adults crossing.
