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Superstar Attendance!

We have been extremely pleased with the attendance levels since September. The number of children with 100% attendance is fantastic and we are very proud to be able to report that **the overall attendance figure for the school since September is currently 97.04%**. We should be aiming for an overall figure of 97% or above, so if attendance is sustained at the levels seen over the past 3 terms, we will be much improved on last year where our yearly attendance figure was 95.6%. Lateness has improved significantly too; we cannot stress enough the importance of being in school on time to ensure your child enjoys a calm start to the school day and thank you for ensuring your child(ren) are here well before 9am. Your co-operation with attendance is absolutely vital. Time spent away from school is time that a child can never get back. Unless they are genuinely unwell or there is an exceptional circumstance, all children are expected in school. Where attendance falls below 90%, a letter will be sent home to parents detailing the exact attendance figure and the next steps that could possibly be taken. In more extreme circumstances, where attendance falls consistently below 80%, we will need to notify our Education Welfare Officer.

Dropping off Late/picking up early Systems

Should your child arrive late to school, you will now need to accompany them into the school office and sign a record of lateness with Mrs Beard. Please do not drop your child off at the gates if they are late, leaving them to walk in alone, as we will be tracking lateness and sending letters to parents where persistent lateness is becoming an issue. Similarly, if you are picking your child up early for any reason, you will be asked to sign to say they are leaving the premises and the reason why they are going. We are also tracking instances where children appear to be consistently leaving school early and should this become an issue, we will make contact with the parents via a formal letter.
