Chickens



Our resident chickens have received an upgrade to their accommodation this week, with the addition of a new Chicken Run added to their existing compound. They are now let out every morning and then put away at the end of the school day, with nominated children taking responsibility for feeding, providing water and cleaning them out under the supervision of an adult. Our chickens are now also laying eggs which encourages the children to further understand the concept of where eggs come from and how they are a source of food.

Fab Friday

As you know from previous newsletters, we are promoting spiritual, moral, social and cultural development in school and last week saw the launch of the first of our Fab Friday sessions.

Fab Friday is taking place in the very last session of a Friday afternoon and sees the whole school mixed into 4 groups and working with a teacher on a given theme.

We felt that this term, as music is a school priority, we would focus the sessions on each group learning to sing a classic Disney song, complete with a performance in a whole school singing competition in the last week of term. Mrs Talbot, as music subject leader is not responsible for a group but will provide a music master-class each week with a different team.

Working in this way helps to develop the children's team work skills. We will also use this time to encourage the children to reflect on wider world issues and cultures as well discussing moral dilemmas and topics which are important to the children and their lives.
