
Christmas Productions

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Pupil Progress Updates

Each term we look closely at the progress children are making as well as ways in which we can enrich the curriculum further to ensure the children are making as much progress as possible. Where children may have made less than expected progress this term, we identify the possible reasons why and look at extra support for the forthcoming term. We feel that, as parents, you should be as fully informed of your child's current level of attainment and the progress they are making in line with national expectations. For this reason, children in years 1-6 should have brought home with them a December update which will tell you the sublevel they started at in September and the level they have been assessed as being in December. We will also report on the level of effort made by your child as well as the attendance figure since September. If you would like to discuss the update sheets further, please make an appointment to see your child's class teacher who will be more than happy to provide more information.

You will receive further updates in April and July.

Superstar Attendance!

We have been extremely pleased with the attendance levels since September. The number of children with 100% attendance is fantastic and we are very proud to be able to report that the overall attendance figure for the school since September is currently 96.03%. We should be aiming for an overall figure of 97% and if attendance is sustained at the levels seen over the past 2 terms, we will be much improved on last year where our yearly attendance figure was 95.6%. Lateness has improved significantly too; we cannot stress enough the importance of being in school on time to ensure your child enjoys a calm start to the school day and thank you for ensuring your child(ren) are here well before 9am.

In more extreme circumstances, where attendance falls below 80%, we will need to notify our Education Welfare Officer.
