We continue to be extremely pleased with the attendance levels since September. The number of children with 100% attendance is fantastic and we are very proud to be able to report that **the overall attendance figure for the school since September is currently 97.17%**. As a school, we are aiming for an overall figure of 97% or above, so if attendance is maintained at the levels seen over the past 4 terms, we will be much improved on last year where our yearly attendance figure was 95.6%.
