#### Parent Consultations

We have decided to once again hold Parent Consultations in the form of telephone calls from the teaching staff to parents/carers. You have already been sent an information letter which explains this further and we are very much looking forward to once again holding these conversations with you, following the success of the last round which took place in November.

As part of the process, we will be sending out the Pupil Profile Sheets which will explain much of the information that the teaching staff will expand upon as part of the conversation but it will also allow you for you to generate any questions that you may wish to ask in response the information.

Pupil Profile Sheets will be sent out during the first week back after Easter. These sheets will also include your date and time of the call, which will be allocated to you by the staff.

#### National Tutoring Programme

You may have seen within the media that in response to the pandemic, the Government has created the National Tutoring Programme (NTP), which allows us to use teachers to help provide additional catch up based sessions on specific objectives. We have been incredibly fortunate to secure the ongoing services of Mrs Dawn Jones, who is an incredibly experienced teacher, to work with our children 3 days per week and whilst all year groups will work with Mrs Jones, we have prioritised year groups starting with the eldest children first. We will let parents of each year group know when it is time for their child's year group focus however, parents should be aware that not all children will be selected to undertake this provision as it might be that other provision provided by the school may better suit a child's needs.

#### Mrs Garriock-Retirement

Many of the children throughout school, having started in Reception, will have had the absolute pleasure of experiencing Foundation Stage with Mrs Garriock who has worked as a Teaching Assistant and Higher-Level Teaching Assistant within our school for an incredible 16 years. As an experienced Early Years practitioner, Mrs Garriock is such a valued member of staff who has always worked her hardest to ensure that our children are the best that they can be right from their very first day in school.

Recently, Mrs Garriock has made the decision to retire from her roles and responsibilities at Easter and enjoy some down time with her husband as we come through the pandemic and they can enjoy time together away from work.

Whilst we are delighted that Mr and Mrs Garriock will have opportunities to enjoy their time travelling (we are hoping for postcards from some interesting locations), we haven't quite fathomed what life in Ancaster will be like without her as many of the longest serving staff members have never known the school without her! **We wish Mrs Garriock all the absolute best and know that she will be popping back to see us whenever she can!**

### Important message regarding testing for COVID-19 from Lincolnshire County Council

We are aware that the recent expansion of home-testing for COVID-19 may be causing some confusion.

It is extremely important to be aware that testing using Lateral Flow Devices (LFDs) is only appropriate for people who are **not** symptomatic.

**Anyone who has any of the COVID-19 symptoms (fever, persistent cough, change in the sense of taste or smell) should immediately self-isolate, along with their household, and arrange a Polymerase Chain Reaction test (PCR) at a testing site.** This is a legal requirement; in no circumstances should an LFD test be used instead of booking a PCR test; as these tests do not have the required sensitivity for symptomatic testing and are likely to produce false-negative results. This could result in children & staff members attending school when they are infectious.

**It should also be noted that LFD tests are not approved for use for primary-age children, and parents of primary schools children should not administer LFD tests to these children in any circumstances.**

It is important that all schools do not allow staff or children to attend school when they are symptomatic because they have a negative LFD test result. Anyone symptomatic should self-isolate and arrange a PCR test. Very simply, **symptoms = PCR test; only people [adults] without symptoms should be using LFD tests.**
